Age: 2,5 – 6(7) years



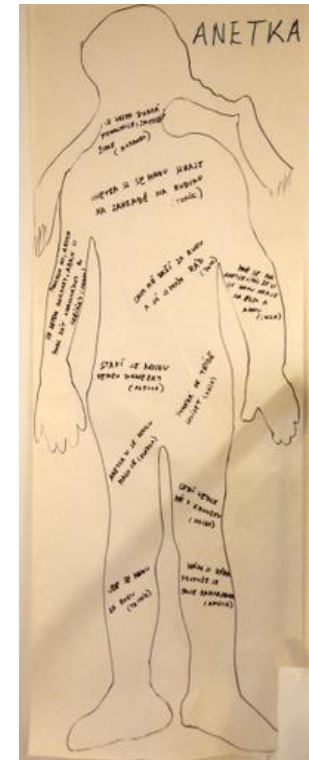
Teachers involved in piloting
