#### 15 events have been carried out within this project:

#### Event 1: Intercultural Student-Journal Workshop in Albania

**Participation:** The event involved 50 citizens, including 48 participants from the city of Tirana (**Albania**), 2 participants from the city of Budapest (**Hungary**).

Location / Dates: The event took place in Rruga Don Bosko (Tirana, Albania), from 26/02/2019 to 31/03/2019

**Short description:** The aim of the event was that young students learn how the totalitarian propaganda was worked. With the help of the foreigner teachers, the workshop participants had to make together a "samizdat" newspaper.

#### Event 2: Intercultural Student-Journal Workshop in Hungary

**Participation:** The event involved 32 citizens, including 30 participants from the city of Budapest (**Hungary**), 2 participants from the city of Sofia (**Bulgaria**).

#### Event 15: Censorship Festival in Hungary

**Participation:** The event involved 342 citizens, including 8 participants from the city of Prague (**Czech Republic**), 7 participants from the city of Tirana (**Albania**), 8 participants from the city of Lodz (**Poland**), 7 participants from the city of Sofia (**Bulgaria**), 9 participants from the city of Bucharest (**Romania**), 8 participants from the city of Bratislava (**Slovakia**), 295 participants from the city of Budapest (**Hungary**). **Location / Dates:** The event took place in Dürer Kert (**Budapest, Hungary**), from 19/09/2019 to 19/09/2019.

**Short description:** The aim of the event was to remembering the artist-victims of the totalitarian censorship. With this cross-national cultural festival, we wanted to commemorate to the oppressed artists and the cultural opposition movements from the Soviet Bloc.
